16810-23 DWI Prevention Efforts

Presenters: Kristine Coblentz and Katherine Hudspeth

Kristine Coblentz spoke about DWI Prevention efforts. A recent news article went out about the newly revised DARE program at Barranca Elementary. There is growing interest in program as two more elementary schools look forward to scheduling Spring classes. General prevention efforts include January's Prevention theme, kindness, and The Great Kindness Challenge looks to students and families practicing intentional kindness and helping to build a foundation of community. Prevention will offer a Youth Mental Health First Aid class on a Saturday to offer different access point for people. The first parent events will be February 7th, at Barranca School with Mary Beth Stevens presenting a short Crucial Conversations focused on Strategies for Managing and Addressing Conflict. School counselors will also speak to the use of restorative circles. All parents and caregivers to LAPS students are welcome. Additionally, all Barranca staff will receive a separate Crucial Conversations skill building training.

Katherine Hudspeth added two additional SROs (Student Resource Officers) have interest in attending DARE training. Upcoming prevent efforts look to partnering with LAPD and SALA for a Hawk Hangout event.

DWI Treatment - Jordan Redmond and Adrianna Delvo

Adrianna Delvo provided a RACSTOP program update - lowest client numbers to date with 17 and 2 part-time providers compared with a typical 40-45 clients and 5 providers. There are no Aftercare clients and 1 in case management program. Provider case load has increased as RACSTOP's Director is out on leave. There have been 3 case referrals from Los Alamos County and a few LANL employee inquiries, but screening appointments for an assessment waiting list are not offered at this time. The Clinical Supervisor Khalsa will review program in coming weeks to allow for more scheduling. RACSTOP is hiring.

Jordan Redmond shared SMART Recovery with only 3 meetings in December with 6 in attendance and a total of 16 encounters. January meetings already showing increased attendance, both regulars and new folks. Los Alamos Family Council is always looking to hire more staff to be able to serve clients on the wait list. An Intern may start this month and an interview for an additional therapist has been scheduled.

Los Alamos National Labs Update - Lauren Smith

Lauren Smith reported as of December 28, 2022, LANL has 28 open cases with alcohol or drug involvement, 18 DWI, 6 alcohol treatment both in/outpatient then becomes Fitness for Duty for those wishing to earn back Clearance, 3 Domestic Violence (DV) arrests with alcohol, 1 entered drug treatment, 4 pending DWIs, arrest, or alcohol related issues.

As of January 12, 2023, cases include 1 DWI, 1 in alcohol treatment, and 1 DV incident involving alcohol. LANL sends educational email and employee bulletins related to alcohol incidents and supports available. To lower barriers for LANL employees seeking help, on

campus options for support to protect anonymity are being explored.
